

Custom Survey Report 07.28.2021 - 07.31.2021

Performed by Spry Strategies and Chart Consulting

The Georgia Statewide Voters of Color Survey was conducted by IVR Landline and Online Interviews from July 28 - July 31 among a random sample of 600 likely General Election voters of color, who were double screened by the stratified sample and a screening question on ethnicity, on which Caucasians were dropped. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.0 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Q1: Voter Screen Are you at least 18 years old and registered to vote in the state of Georgia? Sample Size: 600



Q2: Voter Propensity When thinking ahead to the 2022 Midterm elections- how likely are you to vote? Sample Size: 600











Do you approve or disapprove of the job Raphael Warnock is doing as Senator? Sample Size: 599































Q21: General Vote History When thinking about the past 4 general elections (00, 018, 016, 014) - how many have you voted in? Sample Size: 600






